SUBJECT: 1. Use of Dealer Procured Pistons

2. Clarifications/Corrections to Iteration Outlier Criteria

During the November 15, 2019 conference call, the Sequence IX Surveillance Panel agreed to the following changes to Test Method D8291-19:

- 1. To allow the use of alternate pistons. Section 7.2.1 and new footnote 9 have been added to identify which pistons are acceptable for testing purposes.
- 2. Several clarifications to determining of pre-ignition outliers. Sections 12.2.2.1 and 12.2.2.3 have been revised to clarify the invalid criteria screening.

These revised text and or section(s) have been highlighted in red and are effective November 15, 2019.

Revises D8291-19

7.2.1 Use short blocks with installed pistons stamped with BB on the piston crown. Where BB stamped pistons are not installed, use pistons, part number AG9Z-6108-D⁹, stamped AA1 and AB1.

Renumber existing footnotes 9 to 29 as 10 to 30, respectively.

12.2.2.1 Remove all cycles with a $MFB2 > 30^{\circ}$.

12.2.2.3 After all invalid MFB2 and PP cycles have been removed (see 12.2.2.1 and 12.2.2.2), remove all cycles with a pressure minimum voltage (PMINV) differing from the mean of remaining PMINV by more than 0.5 V. For example, if the mean PMINV of the remaining engine cycles on cylinder 1 is -8.02 V, remove all cycles with PMINV < -8.52 V or a PMINV > -7.52 V.
